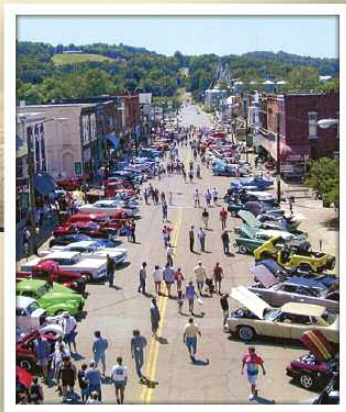
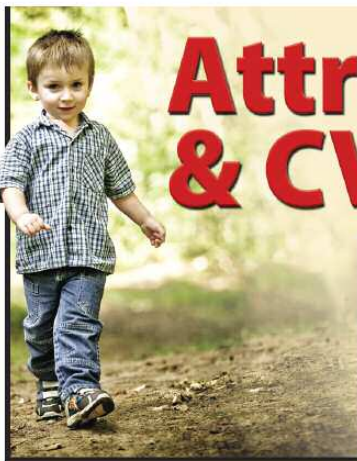

Loudonville's Annual Classic Car Show

The Loudonville-Mohican area has a spectacular calendar of events lined up for 2010, and best of all, the fun takes place all year 'round. In addition to our exciting festivals, you'll also discover many other special attractions sure to please all ages - from museums to historical sites and more.

Catch a glimpse of area history at Wolf Creek/Pine Run Grist Mill, where on seasonal weekends the restored mill is open for viewing. Then return for its special event dates. See the lifestyle of our ancestors at Pioneer Days, or sample locally made wines at Wine at the Mill Festival. The Civil War era is on display at Colonial Soldiers Weekend. Enjoy live music, food, and sample from over 70 kinds of beer during OctoberFest.

The Great Mohican Indian Pow Wow has been an area favorite for over 25 years. Taking place in both July and September, this top-rated event both educates and entertains audiences with its display of Native American culture. Bring the family to the Mohican Arts In Nature Festival for living history re-enactments and other artful presentations depicting our area's past. Music fans will love the Mohican Bluegrass Festival, a 3-day event featuring local and national bluegrass acts. Shoppers flock to the Prairie Peddler Festival, held over two weekends each October, where craftsmen display their ware while folk musicians entertain at this old west themed event.

You don't have to build a log home to enjoy Log Cabin Days, a September tradition at Hochstetler Milling. Take

log home tours, visit with home ware exhibitors, and listen to home building workshops. The chain saw carving and timber jack competitions create fun for the entire family.

Downtown Loudonville hosts several exciting events throughout the year. Visitors will find arts, crafts, and food vendors in Central Park during Memorial and Labor Day weekends. The Independence Day celebration includes an antique show in the park, fireworks, and one of Ohio's best Classic Car Shows - on July 3 this year. And don't forget the 122nd annual Loudonville Free Street Fair in October. While in town tour the Cleo Redd Fisher Museum to learn about Loudonville's history, from Flxible Company memorabilia to exhibits honoring local inventor Charles Kettering.

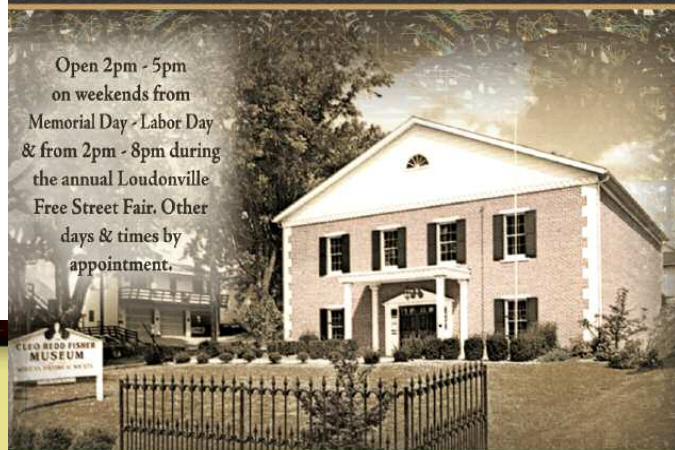
